Negotiation 101: The Foundation Corporate Talk

Most of us think that salary negotiation starts in the conversation where we name the dollar figure we want to be paid. It feels like success (or failure!) hinges on getting the wording right in that one conversation, and the things we do or don't say will make or break our negotiation. Talk about a recipe for stress!

The good news is that effective negotiation actually starts much earlier and involves a progressive approach to building the case for the salary you want. Great salary negotiation involves building a value-focused approach over time. It doesn't have to all come down to a single, high-stress moment!
